

#### **SUNDAY, APRIL 7: DEPARTURE**

Depart for Paris on an overnight flight.

#### **MONDAY, APRIL 8: PARIS, FRANCE**

Arrive in Paris this morning and check into your hotel. Guests who have booked the suggested flights will be met at the airport and transferred to the hotel. On a leisurely boat cruise on the Seine this afternoon, gain an awe-inspiring perspective of this enchanting city while enjoying refreshments. Then gather for a welcome reception at the hotel.

#### **TUESDAY, APRIL 9: PARIS**

Take a morning private visit to the Musée d'Orsay, a former train station that now houses the world's largest collection of Impressionist art. A curator will provide context on the history of the museum and its collection as you admire works by some of the most famous artists of the late 19th and early 20th centuries, including Gustave Courbet, Édouard Manet, Paul Cézanne, and the Pennsylvania-born Mary Cassatt. After lunch, embark on a private tour of the Musée de l'Orangerie, a beautiful museum located in the Tuileries Gardens. The museum is home to eight paintings from Claude Monet's Water Lilies, a series of nearly 300 oil paintings that Monet composed from 1896 to 1920. The eight paintings here are displayed side by side in the museum's oval room, creating a mesmerizing and immersive experience. Later, enjoy exclusive access to a very special private art collection in a stylish venue. This evening, savor dinner at one of Paris's acclaimed restaurants. Enjoy a special educational wine tasting with your meal, an oenophile's journey through the diverse wines of France. B,L,D

#### WEDNESDAY, APRIL 10: PARIS

Begin the day with a private tour of the Louvre, with special in-depth viewings of its works by American artists, including prominent landscape painters Thomas Cole and George Inness. You will have time to explore more of the Louvre's extraordinarily extensive collections on your own and enjoy lunch at leisure. In the afternoon, return to the grounds of the Palais du Louvre for a privately guided visit to the Musée des Arts Décoratifs, a museum of decorative arts and design that houses more than 100,000 objects from the 15th century to the present day. With your private guide, delve into its prestigious collection featuring celebrated artisans and designers who shaped French taste, from Boulle and Sèvres to Perriand and Starck. Explore iconic styles from Gothic and Louis XVI to Art Nouveau and Art Deco, and marvel at their exceptional Fashion and Textile collections, including ancient textiles and haute couture creations. Later, visit a private art collection. This evening, you will gather for a cocktail reception at a memorable venue, with dinner at leisure. B,R








#### THURSDAY, APRIL 11: PARIS / ORLÉANS / PARIS

Travel to Orléans, the sister city of Wichita, located about two hours south of Paris, perched along the stunning Loire River. Joan of Arc liberated Orléans in 1429, and she is honored to this day as the Maid of Orléans. In August 1944, Americans, including the 137th Infantry from the Kansas 35th Division, were the first to liberate the people of Orléans from Nazi occupation. In 1973, Wichita and Orléans formally became sister cities. Meet local residents, including the mayor of the beautiful city who will join the group for lunch. In the evening, return to Paris and enjoy some time for yourself.

#### FRIDAY, APRIL 12: PARIS

Today, explore Montmartre, the creative heart of Paris, where artists such as Pablo Picasso, Vincent van Gogh, Henri Toulouse-Lautrec, Suzanne Valadon, Amadeo Modigliani, and Loïs Mailou Jones have lived and worked. For generations, talented artists of all genres have come to this neighborhood to hone their craft and commune with other artists. Enjoy a wonderful walking tour to watch currentday artists at work and take inside looks at the studios of many famous artistic masters, such as Picasso, Renoir, and Van Gogh. You will have some free time for lunch in Montmartre. In the afternoon, head to the summit of the Butte Montmartre, the highest point in Paris, to experience a guided tour of the Sacré-Coeur Basilica, completed in 1914. This beautiful white basilica stands as a visual feast amid the city's iconic skyline. Inside, look up at the ceiling of its apse, which features France's largest mosaic (nearly 5,100 sq. ft.), designed by Luc-Olivier Merson to represent the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In the evening, return to the hotel to get ready for a festive farewell reception and dinner at a special venue, as we bid adieu to Paris. B,R,D
